Can we begin by reading my mammogram report together?

- It is your right to have access to this report
- Your doctor should readily provide it to you upon request
- You may be able to access your report through your online portal

How confident are you the test(s) you've prescribed will find any cancers present?

What additional screening options are available if I have dense breasts? (cat. C or D)

- Mammograms will find less than half of all cancers in people with dense breast tissue

What insurance code will you be using for the test you're prescribing?

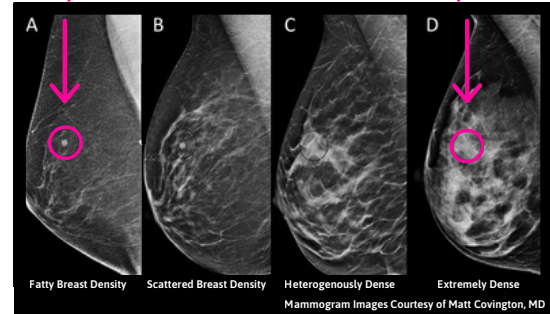
- Use this code to verify coverage through your insurance company

Can you tell me what category of breast density I am?

Can YOU Find the Cancer?

- **Category A** - Fatty Breast Density
- **Category B** - Scattered Breast Density
- **Category C** - Heterogenously Dense
- **Category D** - Extremely Dense (C and D are considered dense)

What is my BI-RADS score?

- Doctors use a standard system to describe mammogram findings and results. This system (called the Breast Imaging Reporting and Data System or BI-RADS) sorts the results into categories number 0-6.
